MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: U.S. Army Garrison Fort Devens Policy Memorandum #9 Fort Devens Dining Facility (DFAC) Dress Code.

1. REFERENCE: AR-670-1, Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia, 31 March 2014
2. PURPOSE: To establish procedures for all personnel (Military and Civilians) to abide with the proper wear and appearance of Army Uniforms and proper wear of civilian attire when coming to dine in the dining facility.
3. APPLICABILITY: This policy is applicable to Soldiers and Soldier's Families, DA Civilians, Contractor Personnel (in possession with the US Army CAC cards), and Tenant Units.
4. POLICY:
 - a. Headgear will not be worn in the dining facility unless an individual is "under arms." Only Law Enforcement Agency and Military Police on duty may enter "under arms." IAW AR 670-1, para 3-7 L (2).
 - b. Weapons are not authorized in the dining facility. Soldiers or units arriving at the DFAC with weapons, will ground weapons uniformly outside the facility and post a guard.
 - c. Authorized military and civilian clothing will not be mixed. Military uniforms will be worn in accordance with appropriate service regulations. Physical Fitness Uniforms (PFU) is allowed but must be generally clean and not excessively wet with perspiration.
 - d. Undergarments will not be worn as outer garments. Rollers, shower caps and pin curls are not allowed. Excessively revealing tank tops/sleeveless shirts will not be worn.
 - e. Clothing that is ripped or soiled that presents an unhealthy or unclean appearance is not allowed in the dining facility.
 - f. Shirts must be worn at all times. Shirts must cover armpits and body torso. Shirts must not display profanity or obscene sketches, pictures, or remarks.
 - g. Shoes must be worn at all times. Shower shoes (Flip-Flops) are not authorized in the dining facility. Closed-toe sandals are authorized.

h. The Food Program Manager (FPM), Quality Assurance Evaluator (QAE) or contracting officer's representative (COR) may refuse service to personnel dressed in an extremely offensive manner or excessively unclean.

5. PROCEDURES. All personnel will dress appropriate in accordance with policy listed above.
